’iin ’ee héetewise

I love you! (singular)

’éetx héetewise ’oykalóona

I love you! (plural)

piimúnim

Call me!

’iinim heté’ew

My special one.

heté’ew ’ee wées

You are special.

’iinim wic’éey

Be mine.

wic’éey ’iinim tim’ine

Be my heart!

’ee wées ’iinim tim’ine

You are my heart”

’ee wées ’iinim tim’néepe

You are in my heart.

tá’c hekípe

Good looking!

cicyúk’is tim’ine

Sweet Heart

’iinim cicyúk’is

My sugar!

’ee wées tóosx

You are tops!

hamóol’ic

Cute!

hamóol’ic ’ee wées

You are cute!

tim’ine

Heart!

’éeysin’/’éey’s’nin’ heté’ew léeheyn

Happy love day!

’inciwáatx wées

I am single (alone).

wéet wic’éeyo’qa ’iinim ’iwéepne?

Will you be my wife?

Wéet pikyúuyu’komqa

Will you marry me?

wéet kiyúuyu’ kum?

Will you marry me? (Will you come towards me? This is an old language use.)

pe’síine ’anáaswaqalpin

Hug someone.

’anáaswaqalpx

Hug them.

hímkaç’a’k

Kiss.

hímkaç’a’kim

Kiss me.

miyapkáawitqan

Younger baby (Call cupid this.)

’ahímkaç’a’x ’im’cúipna

Kiss your sister. (Female’s younger sister)

’ahímkaç’a’x ’ípne

Kiss him/her.

Waqalpím

Hug me!

’óoqalpx Bessiene

Hug Bessie.
